The Post-9/11 Veterans Education Assistance Improvements Act of 2010

(* Cap Increased from \$17,500 to \$18,077.50 - Effective 1 Aug 2012)

POST 9/11 GI BILL CHANGES- Effective August 1, 2011

- For Veterans and their transferees simplifies the tuition and fee rates for those attending a public school and creates a national maximum for those enrolled in a private or foreign school
 - Pays all public school in-state tuition and fees;
 - Private and foreign school costs Are Capped at \$18,077. 50* ANNUALLY;
 LIU IS A PRIVATE UNIVERSITY
- For Active Duty Members and their transferees creates a national rate for those active duty members enrolled in a private or foreign school pursuing a degree
 - o Pays all public school in-state tuition and fees;
 - o Private and foreign school costs are capped at \$18,077.50* annually
- Allows VA to pay MGIB (chapter 30) and MGIB-SR (chapter 1606) 'kickers', or college fund payments, on a monthly basis instead of a lump sum at the beginning of the term

Prorates housing allowance by the student's rate of pursuit (rounded to the nearest tenth)

o A student training at a rate of pursuit of 75% would receive 80% of the BAH rate

Break or interval pay is no longer payable under **any** VA education benefit program

WHAT TO EXPECT AT LIU - BROOKLYN

- ➤ Complete a FAFSA as soon as possible. The more <u>free</u> aid you are awarded, the better!
 - If you <u>DO NOT</u> plan on completing a FAFSA, please advise the certifying official ASAP. Complete your FAFSA on the website: www.fafsa.ed.gov
- > Initial certification is submitted to the VA at the end of the first week of classes
 - It will only include the total number of registered credits so your Book and Housing Allowances will be sent to you. Tuition and fees are submitted separately further into the semester.
- A second certification with tuition and fees will be submitted to the VA around or after midterm once your financial aid is applied.
 - Reported tuition and fees to the VA will be less any applicable financial aid you received, as the VA is now the end payer.
- Once registered for classes, you will receive a bill. This is an automated and normal process. Your name will be sent to the Student Financials Office for a temporary clearance until the VA makes payment to the University.
- Vets or servicemen who are less than 100% eligible under the Post 9/11 GI Bill and those veterans eligible for <u>other</u> non-Post 9/11 VA Educational benefits, <u>must</u> obtain a temporary clearance from the Student Financials Office in the Metcalfe Bldg, M310.
- Student ID Based on the Student Financials temporary clearance, you will be able to obtain your student ID by the first day of classes from room M413 (Metcalfe Bldg, 4th floor) Office Services.
 - You may call Office Services at 718/488-1427 approximately one week prior to classes to verify your name is on the veterans list cleared to receive an ID.
- ➤ Plan Ahead!!! **Save funds to purchase your books**. The VA book allowance <u>may not</u> be available when classes begin and usually will not cover the full cost of all your books.
 - The Student Financials Office can issue a book voucher up to \$800 against your PELL grant (Completing a FAFSA will determine eligibility for PELL)
- > Confirm your class attendance by the 10th day of each month in the Registrar's Office.
- > Advise the certifying official <u>immediately</u> if you should stop attending, drop or withdraw from any of your classes.
- ➤ The VA will send you an updated letter with <u>each</u> certification submitted. It states: "<u>What</u> <u>Our Records Show</u>" Please bring this letter to the Registrar's Office so a copy can be made for your file. It indicates your remaining benefits and other important information.

Determining your VA Educational Benefits

The best way to determine your benefits from the Department of Veteran Affairs is by submitting an application via the VONAPP program.

The VA will then issue a letter indicating what educational benefits you are entitled to in the form of either a:

Certificate of Eligibility (COE)

Or

Notice of Basic Eligibility (NOBE)

Upon receipt of the above, you will have an understanding of what benefits you will have to utilize for your educational endeavors.

There are many chapters and programs that you may be eligible for including:

- Chapter 30 Montgomery GI BILL
- Chapter 31 Vocational Rehabilitation
- Chapter 33 Post 9-11 GI BILL
- Chapter 35 Dependents Educational Assistance (DEA)
- Chapter 1606 Montgomery GI BILL (Select Reserve)
- Chapter 1607 Reserve Educational Assistance Program (REAP)

Important Note: If you receive documentation that you believe was processed in error by the VA, it is important that you complete the appeal process. Directions for the VA appeal process are included in all correspondences from the VA. If you need a copy of the information, feel free to contact the Office of Veteran and Military Affairs.

Transcripts from Military Experience

To maximize your military training/experience and any previous educational course completion, you should forward any and all transcripts from previous institutions to LIU Brooklyn.

Immunizations

All LIU Brooklyn students regardless of major are required to provide proof of immunization. The MMR/Meningitis form is available online at liu.edi/Brooklyn/uhms/forms. **THE COMPLETED MMR/MENINGTITIS FORM IS DUE PRIOR TO THE START OF CLASSES.**

Keeping you well so you can excel is our primary concern. To ensure the overall health of each student, NYS Public Health Laws 2165 (MMR Requirements) and 2167 (Meningococcal Meningitis) are strictly enforced.

Your immunization records must legibly document two complete dates (month/date/year) for your MMR. If you are missing on date, you have two options:

- 1.) Obtain an MMR Booster
- Obtain a Titre (a lab test demonstrating your level of immunities for the MMR). Titres are
 accepted as valid only when the actual lab results are attached documenting your levels are
 positive/immune.

You may also go to the New York State Department of Health for free shots. For information about clinics, contact the Immunization Hotline at 212-676-2273, or if you are in NYC, dial 311.
