
Dear Hudson Herald Community Member:

SPC 745L Listening With the Heart: Counseling Issues Related to Medical Illness (Tuesdays and Thursdays, May 28 - July 1, 4:30 – 8:15 p.m., Westchester Campus)

An acute or chronic medical illness can affect every aspect of an individual's or family's functioning and cuts across all socioeconomic and cultural differences. This course will address psychological, social and spiritual aspects of illness; advanced communication skills with the medically ill; family and caregiver burnout; professional caregiver stress, burnout and compassion fatigue; issues of end of life care. We will also consider the development of presence and mindfulness when encountering suffering. The course will employ lectures, guest lecturers and interviews, film and video clips, class discussion and creative activities. Teacher Certification Exams Update

As you may be aware, new certification exams will be required as of May1 2014. Teacher education candidates finishing their degrees in May, 2014 will need to successfully complete the edTPA performance assessment, as well as the Academic Literacy Test, Educating All Students Test and the appropriate Content Specialty Test(s) in lieu of the what is now required: the LAST, ATS-W and current Content Specialty Test(s). For candidates who already hold initial teaching certificates and will not be ready to apply for an additional certificate until after May 1, 2014, the only exams required are the appropriate, new content specialty tests. If a teacher education candidate holds a permanent teaching certificate, rather than an initial or professional one, speak to an advisor to determine what tests are required and do so whether graduating before or after May, 2014. The teacher education faculty will be scheduling workshops beginning this Fall (2013) to acquaint students with the nature of these new exams. Please note the students in all institutions of higher education in New York State who are completing their studies next May will need to meet the new requirements.

N.Y.C. Education Recruiter Presents at LIU Hudson at Rockland

LIU Hudson welcomed **Donald Garner**, NYC Dept. of Education recruiter, to the Rockland campus on February 28th. Mr. Garner had made time each year to visit the Rockland campus since many of our students are now among the "best and brightest" teachers in the New York City system. His presentation not only offered valuable insight into the application process, but informed students of the nuances of the system and the specific pieces to which all applicants should pay particular attention including acceptance into the "select teacher" corps. Application reviewers initially scrutinize the writing prompt, so students interested in applying should take special care in addressing this piece.

Did you know that the starting salary for a teacher in NYC with a Master's Degree is now over \$50,000 per year? N.Y.C. strongly encourages all candidates to consider a position in one of the 'high needs' schools. This enables eligibility for an additional tax-free grant of \$3,400 per year for up to four years.

Dr. Carol Kennedy Presents at the United Nations

On Feb. 7, 2013 Dr. Carol Kennedy, Program Director, Special Education Instructional Technology of LIU Hudson (Rockland) gave a presentation and participated in a panel at the United Nations Fifty-first Session of the Commission for Social Development NGO Committee on Mental Health "Promoting empowerment of people in achieving poverty eradication, social integration and full employment and decent work for all." Dr. Kennedy presented on "Incorporating Technology into the Academic and Residential Treatment Programs to Improve Children's Academic and Social Skills at St. Christopher's REACH Program." She talked about ongoing research on the Social Stories Video Project and use of facial recognition software to improve social skills in adolescents with Autism Spectrum Disorder, use of student-created social stories videos to help clinicians, residential staff and families in the homes to work with these youngsters. Ultimately improvement in social skills will help with transition and employment of these individuals.

Flipped Learning Update

Professor Marshall continues to teach using the Flipped Learning model in which lectures and other direct instruction takes place outside of class and class is devoted to interactive and collaborative work by students. She has presented her flipped classroom at several recent conferences, such as the NYSCATE – New York State Association for Computers and Technology in Education, and TESOL – Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages. Dr. Marshall also serves on the Research Review Committee of Flipped Learning Network, which will be issuing a White Paper on the topic next month. Her students recently completed an anonymous questionnaire with comments on their experience in the flipped classroom in Fundamentals of Linguistics. As a group, the students agreed that they enjoy this type of instruction. One student commented: "The flipped classroom is the best learning environment I've ever experienced, and I'm on my second master's degree. It not only enhances my learning, it enhances my relationships with peers. All of this is made possible through the careful, deliberate and imaginative efforts of the professor teaching the course. Although she's not at the head of the classroom most of the time, she's what I'd call 'leading from behind' - a role I wish more teachers would undertake. If they knew that leading from behind didn't mean a loss of their control or importance, I think more teachers would be willing to try the flipped classroom. I have more respect for a teacher using this method as it has been used in this class than I have for traditional sage on the stage teachers. It's more challenging for the teacher, but justified by the results." Dr. Marshall has developed her own interpretation of flipped learning and she will be presenting this model at the 6th Annual Flipped Learning Conference in Minnesota in June.

Operation Prom Dress

The Counseling Honor Society of LIU Hudson's Rockland campus in Orangeburg, NY, brought happiness into the lives of local teenage girls. The Counseling Honor Society collected formal dresses, shoes, and accessories to be distributed to needy adolescents in the community. This is the fifth year that the Honor Society has partnered with the Salvation Army's Suffern Temple in Spring Valley to supply gowns for sweet sixteen parties, graduations, and other special occasions. The final count was 80 gowns, 60 pairs of shoes, and 6 handbags.
