WITHDRAWAL POLICY

A student may make a written request to withdraw from one or more courses before the end of the term by completing either an Enrollment Change Form or a Withdrawal Form, as appropriate. Once the appropriate Form is submitted to the Registrar and processed, the student bill (i.e., the student liability) will be adjusted as indicated in the following schedule. The official withdrawal date shall be the date on which the Registrar receives the properly completed Form. The Enrollment Change Form will also require the approval of the student's advisor and instructor if after the withdrawal deadline.
