TRANSFER INFORMATION

Course Transferability

The transferability of course credit depends on, but is not limited to, the following:

- Courses are taken at a regionally accredited college or university
- The grade received is 'C' or higher
- The course is deemed equivalent to a course provided at Long Island University's Brooklyn Campus
- The course is applicable to a degree offered at the Long Island University's Brooklyn Campus

Note(s): Quarter system units should be taken in sequence (ex: Bio 1, Bio 2, Bio 3 = 12 quarter units or 8 semester credits), labs must also be completed in sequence for science coursework. Also, science and math courses should not be more than 10 years old.

To determine if courses at your school are transferable or equivalent to courses that are offered at Long Island University's Brooklyn Campus, you must compare the course descriptions from your school's bulletin to the LIU Brooklyn Undergraduate Bulletin. The bulletin can be viewed on the website at www.liu.edu/brooklyn.

Pre-requisite course requirements:

Students who *have* or *will have* an Associate's or Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university prior to beginning the Professional Phase of the PharmD program will need ***all required science & math courses*** plus ***any 27 (for 2014) or any 24 (for 2015) credits*** in social science or humanities (*i.e. ENG, PHI, SOC, PSY, HUM, ART, MUS, etc.*) with a grade of 'C' or higher to complete the pre-requisite course requirements.

Applicants who will *not* have completed a degree from a regionally accredited college/university must adhere to the list of pre-requisites provided in the undergraduate bulletin.

Applicants with transcripts from outside the U.S.:

Official transcripts from every college/university previously attended, including those from outside the U.S., must be submitted. Also, it is required for all educational records, presented from outside of the U.S, to be *evaluated* and, if not written in English, *translated*. Please see the Credential Evaluation list of acceptable agencies for evaluations and translations at

www2.brooklyn.liu.edu/pharmacy/Credential_Evaluators_list.pdf. In some cases this process may take 8 – 12 weeks so allow enough time for application and program deadlines.

Transfer credit will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Applicant may be asked to submit additional supporting documents.



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Note: Any evaluation and translation submitted from an agency that is not on our list may not be honored.

Standardized Tests:

Those applicants who have completed the following exams may be considered for advanced standing or transfer credit, official test scores should be sent directly to the Admissions Processing Center for consideration:

Advanced Placement (AP), minimum score 3; International Baccalaureate (IB), minimum score HL-4; and College level Examinations Program (CLEP), minimum computer based exam score 50.

REQUIRED PRE-REQUISITE COURSES (FALL 2014 & 2015 ENTRY)

Attached below are the lists of pre-requisite courses required for entry into the Professional Phase (P-3) of the PharmD Program. **These lists represent the required curriculum for all students (LIU and transfer) applying for the professional phase of the program. One list represents 2014 and the other list represents 2015 entry requirements.**

Please use the appropriate list to determine how many pre-requisite courses have already been completed as well as to determine which courses may be lacking. To determine if a course may be transferable use our **Undergraduate Bulletin** along with your school's bulletin to compare the course descriptions. Visit our website at www.liu.edu/brooklyn/academics/bulletins to review all college bulletins including the LIU Brooklyn Undergraduate Bulletin and LIU Pharmacy Bulletin.

Quarter system courses must be taken in sequence. Quarter credits must convert to minimally 8 semester credits for science (courses must include labs) and math courses and 3 semester credits for liberal arts or humanities courses.

Applicants who have or will have an undergraduate degree from a regionally accredited college/ university by the end of summer prior to program entry will need any 27 credits in Liberal Arts (Social Science/ Humanities) with a grade of 'C' or higher to satisfy the requirement. Applicants who do not hold an undergraduate degree from a regionally accredited college/ university is required to complete the entire list of pre-requisite courses as listed in the LIU Brooklyn Undergraduate Bulletin and LIU Pharmacy Bulletin.
